BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF OHIO (THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING):

WHEREAS, In February 2003, the Sudan Liberation Army (SLA) 15 and Justice Equality Movement (JEM) from the Darfur region of 16 Sudan clashed with the Janjaweed militia, a group supported by the 17 government of Sudan, in an attempt to oppose the region's extreme 18 political and economic marginalization. Since that time, tens of 19 thousands of civilians have been killed and more than two million 20

civilians have been made internally displaced peoples by the two	21
warring factions. Furthermore, approximately two hundred thousand	22
Darfur refugees have fled across the border to Chad; and	23
WHEREAS, On July 22, 2004, the United States House of	24
Representatives and the United States Senate declared that the	25
atrocities occurring in Darfur are genocide; and	26
WHEREAS, On September 9, 2004, Secretary of State Colin L.	27
Powell stated before the United States Senate Committee on Foreign	28
Relations, "When we reviewed the evidence compiled by our team,	29
along with other information available to the State Department, we	30
concluded that genocide has been committed in Darfur and that the	31
Government of Sudan and the (Janjaweed) bear responsibility - and	32
genocide may still be occurring"; and	33
WHEREAS, President George W. Bush, in an address before the	34
United Nations General Assembly on September 21, 2004, stated, "At	35
this hour, the world is witnessing terrible suffering and horrible	36
crimes in the Darfur region of Sudan, crimes my government has	37
concluded are genocide"; and	38
WHEREAS, As a stabilizing force, the United States has an	39
obligation to promote peace in the region and to work with other	40
foreign governments to end the genocide in the Darfur region of	41
Sudan; now therefore be it	42
