

Am. Sub. HB 119 – Omnibus amendment to Senate Sub Bill
Senate Finance and Financial Institutions Committee
June 12, 2007

- SC-2704 – Redistributes HAVA appropriations from \$3,750,000 each fiscal year to \$4,750,000 in fiscal year 2008 and \$2,750,000 in fiscal year 2009 at the request of the Secretary of State; clarifies the General Assembly's intent related to corrections for H.B. 694 of the 126th General Assembly and permits a board of elections to report the outcome of election investigations to either the prosecuting attorney or the Secretary of State.
- SC-2847 - Rescinds household sewer treatment system (HSTS) rules effective January 1, 2007; reinstates HSTS rules effective prior to January 1, 2007; suspends certain provisions in law regarding HSTS implemented by HB 231 (124th GA) until July 1, 2009; creates the Household Sewage and Small Flow On-Site Sewage Treatment System Study Commission; requires the study commission to submit recommendations to the General Assembly by December 1, 2008; revises the membership of the Sewage Treatment System Technical Advisory Committee and creates the Sewage Treatment System Innovation Fund to assist in the development of new technology.
- SC-2766 - Makes corrections to the enforcement authority given to the Ohio Legal Rights Services agency to enforce subpoenas for access to records.
- SC-2866 – Decreases the Senate-added earmark for Aloise Alzheimer's Center in 235-558 by \$50,000 in each fiscal year and earmarks those funds for the People Working Cooperatively, Inc. project.
- SC-2565 – Permits county commissions, at the request of board of elections, to establish a fund for the purpose of accumulating revenue to pay for the conduct of elections and allows the transfer of money into that fund from any other fund that may be used to pay for elections. In addition, eliminates the requirement that the General Assembly appropriate funds required for advertising statewide ballot language since the state is already responsible for these costs under current law.
- SC-2572 – Streamlines the process for service of notice of adjudications under the Administrative Procedure Act by clarifying when service of notice is complete if a party fails to claim a notice sent by registered mail or when notice is returned due to failure of delivery or rejection.
- SC-2514 – Earmarks \$100,000 per fiscal year from the Ohio Department of Natural Resources's Division of Soil and Water for soil and water quality improvements utilizing best management practices.
- SC-2649-1 – Eliminates the Senate-added earmark for "Making Connections" in 440-416 and instead allows the funds to be used by the Department of Health to make hospital performance information available on its web site.
- SC-2523 – Places the Health Assistance for Children with Catastrophic Illness Council in uncodified law. The Council is to study the feasibility, costs, and benefits of a Medicaid Buy-In program for children with catastrophic mental or physical illness or disability and family income over 300% FPL. Eliminates the authority the Director of JFS has to go forward with any recommendations without legislative action.
- SC 2515 - Permits a countywide school district until February 29, 2008, to sell property to a community action agency that operates an early childhood education program within the district if certain conditions are satisfied.

- SC-2540-1 - Creates the Special Education Scholarship Pilot Program for students with disabilities in grades K-12 to attend alternative public or private special education programs in fiscal year 2009 through fiscal year 2014. The maximum amount of the scholarship is the least of the following: (1) the fees charged by the alternative program; (2) the sum of the per pupil base cost and the special education weighted funding amounts; or (3) \$20,000.
- SC-2630 - Revises provisions related to the School Employees Health Care Board.
- SC-2504 - Adds the president of the Ohio Alliance for Public Telecommunications as a voting member of the eTech Commission and makes other changes related to eTech.
- SC-2476 - Clarifies that preschool physical and occupational therapy services that are eligible for funding from Special Education Enhancements (200-540) may be provided by licensed physical and occupational therapists and by physical and occupational therapy assistants under the supervision of licensed physical or occupational therapists.
- SC-2492 - Requires the Department of Education to base payment for community school students on the percentage of total learning opportunities that were provided to the student over the full school year.
- SC-2692-1 - Specifies that if a district uses Poverty-Based Assistance funds to employ classroom aides to increase classroom learning opportunities, that the aides must be engaged in classroom support activities. Eliminates the requirement that a district submit an annual report on the deployment of Poverty-Based Assistance funds if the district received less than \$10,000 in Poverty-Based Assistance funds.
- SC-2693 - Authorizes the Department of Education to withhold a portion of funding from school districts, community schools, educational service centers or other educational entity for reporting inaccurate data to the Education Management Information System.
- SC-2748 - Clarifies for purposes of tangible personal property tax reimbursement for school districts that the definition of "state education aid" includes the amounts calculated for Poverty-Based Assistance and Parity Aid.
- SC-2726 - Permits the governing authority of a community school to enter into a contract with its sponsor to open an additional school in the 2008-09 school year if the current school: Was rated Excellent or Effective and named a School of Promise for three of the last four school years; has made adequate yearly progress for the last four school years; has been in operation at least five years; is not managed by an operator; and files a copy of the sponsor contract with the State Superintendent of Public Instruction by March 15, 2008.
- SC-2873 - Makes changes to the amendment included in the substitute bill regarding the behavioral health pilot program. These changes were agreed to by the Ohio Association of County Behavioral Health Authorities and the Ohio Association of Health Plans. The amendment will limit the pilot to a small, medium, large and one board consortium, clarify services are for behavioral health services, require the pilot to coordinate with the Medicaid managed care plans under contract with JFS in the region in which the pilot is operating and add managed care plans to the advisory group. The advisory group will also evaluate the pilot.
- SC-2627 - Permits the Board of Speech-Language Pathology to issue a two-year student permit to speech pathology interns.
- SC-2626 - Clarifies that only adult career-technical education programs are subject to the proposed move to the Board of Regents.
- SC-2604 - Increases (200-422) School Management Assistance by \$415,000 in fiscal year 09 and consolidates the earmarks in (200-431) School Improvement Initiatives for

early college high schools and the conversion of large urban high schools into personalized high schools retaining the total for fiscal year 08 but reducing the total amount by \$415,000 in fiscal year 09.

- SC-2619 - Removes the requirement that districts report to eTech the data verification code for each student enrolled in the distance learning clearinghouse and instead requires districts and community schools to report directly to ODE.
- SC-2571 - Requires the Department of Education to submit an annual report to the General Assembly of each school district's aggregate employee salary and benefits expenditures.
- SC-2660- Updates statutory language regarding the provision of special education and related services for children with disabilities to align with federal law.
- SC-2845 - Repeals the requirement that LSC prepare a report in even-numbered years estimating the costs of each education law and administrative law that became effective during the preceding two years.
- SC-2511 - Moves the earmark for the Cleveland Hopkins Airport in FY 08 from the 777-471 line item in ODOT to the 195-677 line item in Development. This allows for the ODOT line item to be used for county airport purposes while retaining the funding for the Cleveland project.
- SC-2603-1 - Earmarks \$1.5 million in fiscal year 08 from the 195-615 line item for the Toledo Marina Project.
- SC-2862 - Prohibits a law enforcement officer from issuing a ticket for a secondary traffic offense at a motor vehicle checkpoint or safety inspection unless the officer makes an arrest or issues a ticket for a violation other than a secondary traffic offense.
- SC-2810 - (AIR007) - Allows the Air Quality Development Authority the use of commodity contracts in connection with the acquisition or construction of air quality facilities.
- SC-2830 - (DAS014-1) - Increases the GRF line items in DAS for the State of Ohio Computer Center, the Equal Opportunity Certification Program, and the Construction Compliance Program by reducing the DAS GRF line item 130-321, State Agency Support, by the amount of the increases.
- SC-2831 - (DAS018-1) - Clarifies that the NextGen project from the as introduced version of the bill is meant to be able to use both of the Third Frontier funds from Development. The item remains funded at its proposed \$20 million level in FY 08.
- SC-2833 - (DEV034) - Clarifies that the Ohio Research Scholars Program earmark of Third frontier funds may come from either the 014 or 011 funds.
- SC-2808 - (DAS021) - Makes clarifying changes to the transfer of the Office of Information Technology to OBM from DAS.
- SC-2832 - (DEV018) - Permits up to 10% of the Thomas Edison Program funding to be used for the administration and operating expenses of the Technology Division.
- SC-2595 - Increases the earmark for methane digesters in 195-660 advanced energy programs and specifies eligibility requirements.
- SC-2651 - Requires the OBM director to transfer funds from the advanced energy fund to the Division of Geological Survey in ODNR to return the division's spending authority to the amounts proposed by the Governor.
- SC-2890 - Permits the OBM director to transfer funds from the advanced energy fund to the Coal Development Office to return the office's spending authority to the amounts proposed by the Governor.

- SC-2886 – (DEV027) – Extends the authority for a county sales & use tax subsidy (“Tax Increment Financing”) for impact facilities until December 31, 2007. “Impact facilities” continue to be defined as \$50 million retail locations with some educational or exhibition space.
- SC-2834 – (DEV035) – Corrects Senate-added language regarding transfers of 166 funds to specify that the transfers are to be made as soon as possible after July 1, 2007.
- SC-2883-1 – (DEV038) – Moves funds between the 195-521 Discover Ohio! line item and 195-407 Travel & tourism line item to account for the correct totals of maintenance and equipment expenses for the division. Creates, though does not earmark funds for, the State Film Bureau to promote media production in Ohio.
- SC-2648 – Requires Development to convene a task force to study state, regional, and local economic development incentives and report on how to strengthen Ohio’s economy by making incentives more effective.
- SC-2805 – (DMR017) – Makes corrective changes at the behest of the agency and the interested parties to the MRDD Medicaid redesign language included by the House.
- SC-2816 – (DMR021) – Specifies how the Tax Equity payments within MRDD’s budget are to be apportioned.
- SC-2835 – (DMR022) – Removes an incorrect reference added by conflicting OBM provisions in the Senate substitute version of the bill.
- SC-2798 – Makes revisions to the Senate substitute bill’s provisions regarding the Gallipolis Developmental Center Pilot Program.
- SC-2677 – (DNR015) – Makes changes to the performance security requirements pertaining to applicants for permits issues under the coal surface mining law. This clarifies a provision added at the behest of OBM to the Senate substitute version of the bill.
- SC-2899 – (EPA015) – Allows the EPA director to issue revised decisions regarding permitting even if the original decision is in the appeals process of the Environmental Review Appeals Commission.
- SC-2762 – Requires E-check extension, if needed, be done annually through Governor’s executive order and specifies that the legislative intent is to discontinue the program if allowed by the federal regulators. Requires the state EPA to annually request that the US EPA provide alternatives to meet federal performance standards and mandates that a report be prepared and submitted on those alternatives.
- SC-2809 – (ETC002-1) – Transfers eTech towers and real property to the Office of Information Technology.
- SC-2522 – Requires, as of July 1, 2009, that county department of JFS applications for Medicaid be submitted and stored electronically.
- SC-2724 – Requires a third-party responsible for coverage of medical care provided to a Medicaid recipient to have a three-year look back rather than a six-year look back.
- SC-2725 – Permits, rather than requires, sanctions against a third-party for violating the bill’s provisions regarding third-party liability for coverage of medical care provided to a Medicaid recipient.
- SC-2561 – Requires JFS to provide guidance to local workforce development policy boards to encourage participation by training providers including proprietary schools.
- SC-2749-2 – (JFS043) – Inserts a technical clean-up for medical support order requirements from the as introduced version of the bill. This deals with health insurance coverage for children who are subjects of a child support order.

- SC-2589 – Earmarks \$50,000 in each fiscal year from TANF for the Alliance Early Childhood Education Pilot Project.
- SC-2577 – Requires a county department of JFS to provide various services regarding screening and support for OWF participants who have been victims of domestic violence.
- SC-2491-1 – Permits Health to promote the establishment of federally qualified health centers or FQHC look-alikes. Allows FQHC's to participate in the medical liability insurance reimbursement program, and allows the Department of Health to establish a pilot program to place two FQHC's within or adjacent to hospital emergency departments.
- SC-2820 – (JFS-MED046) – Specifies that when franchise permit fees are not paid, JFS may withhold an amount up to the payment and penalty until the installment is paid in full.
- SC-2780-1 – Adds legislative members to the Unified Long-term Care Budget Workgroup and requires the workgroup to report to the GA and Joint Legislative Committee on Medicaid Technology and Reform (JLCMTR) as well as the Governor with an outline of the plan for the Unified LTC Budget. Gives OBM authority to transfer money between specific lines contingent on the creation of the stand alone Medicaid Department. Requires OBM & Aging to submit an annual report on the progress and effectiveness of the unified budget. Requires OBM to submit annual reports to the GA and JLCMTR on the progress of the creation of the new stand alone Medicaid Department.
- SC-2840; SC-2869; SC-2870 – Requires ODADAS, RSC, and DMH to consult with OBM and interested parties to increase efficiencies and improve services.
- SC-1757-1 – Requires JFS to contract with a third party to conduct a child care market rate survey in each even numbered year rather than annually.
- SC-2516 – Creates the ICF/MR Reimbursement Study Council and requires a report on the state's Medicaid reimbursement system for ICFs/MR by July 1, 2008.
- SC-2573 – Permits nursing students to practice in Ohio while participating in a component of a prelicensure education program located in another state.
- SC-2602 – Requires JFS and Education to develop a fiscal model that joins early care and education programs under one funding system to provide children with access to affordable quality care and education.
- SC-2537 – Allows the Tobacco Use Prevention and Cessation Foundation to create a non-profit and raise funds.
- SC-2611 – Clarifies that the Ohio Proud agricultural marketing program is allowed to promote Ohio spring water.
- SC-2601 – Increases appropriations in non-GRF funds for the Cultural Facilities Commission using unrestricted interest earnings from fund 030.
- SC-2535 – Earmarks \$650,000 per fiscal year from TANF for the Economic and Community Development Institute for an individual development account program.
- SC-2628 – Further modifies an existing earmark for breast & cervical cancer treatment from the House-passed version of the bill to ensure the funds are usable under the national early detection project.
- SC-2773-1 – Authorizes the bylaws of a regional council of government whose members include at least eight counties to allow proxy attendance and voting.
- SC-2536-1 – Permits certain councils of government to issue securities for acquiring and improving real property.

- SC-2755 – Earmarks \$500,000 in each fiscal year from the Healthy Ohio line item for diabetes management and prevention.
- SC-2584 – Earmarks \$300,000 per fiscal year from the 195-434 Ohio Investment in Training grants line item for the re-tooling for success program at Washington State Community College.
- SC-2771 – Allows the Chancellor of the Board of Regents to allocate up to \$165,000 per fiscal year for the Capitol Scholarship Program (known as the Washington Center Internship Program).
- SC-2853 – Makes corrections to the Senate substitute bill language regarding Children's Hospitals and the cost outlier claims for fiscal years 08 & 09.
- SC-2800 – (OBM094) – Makes temporary changes to the state general obligation debt issuance limits, per a House amendment regarding "avoided obligations" to ensure state debt is not run up after securitization, to limit debt service payments from general fund revenue plus lottery proceeds to 4.25% through 2012 and 4.50% through 2020. Also, requires OBM to make appropriation changes to reflect the utilization of securitization proceeds.
- SC-2812 – (OBM115) – Makes technical corrections to ensure proper distribution of utility property tax replacement payments.
- SC-2826 – (OBM116) – Deletes a duplicative appropriation for the 055-404 line item as those expenses will be covered by funds appropriated in SB 321 of the 126th General Assembly.
- SC-2824 – (OBM118) – Corrects Senate-added language regarding fiscal year 07 transfers.
- SC-2892 – Corrects the name of a Senate-added scholarship program matching fund to be the "James A. Rhodes Leadership Foundation."
- SC-2814 – (SFC005) – Directs securitization proceeds for School Facilities to fund 032 rather than 021.
- SC-2896 – (TAX044) – Makes technical corrections to the homestead exemption provisions.
- SC-2895 – (TAX045) – Clarifies that the House-added reduction of the kWh tax rate for self-assessors is based on a meter reading period rather than on a date.
- SC-2898 & SC-2894 – (TAX046 & TAX047) – Makes changes to harmonize tax sections of the code to changes made in the Senate substitute version of the bill regarding direct shipment of wine.
- SC-2893 – (TAX048) – Corrects a misspelling.
- SC-2574 – Makes clarifying changes to the Senate-added cost-benefit analysis language regarding the historic building tax credit.
- SC-2615-1 – Makes bond counsel requested changes dealing with sales tax revenue bonds for a Cuyahoga County convention center project.
- SC-2769 – Specifies that the Senate substitute bill clarification of when school districts may go to the ballot for school district income tax levies will not commence with the August 7, 2007 election, as filing deadlines will have been missed upon the likely enactment of HB 119.
- SC-2513 – Eliminates the language regarding income eligibility for Student Choice grants and returns to the current method of apportioning based upon the amounts appropriated. Additionally, allows the unspent balance to be carried over and appropriated for the same purpose from fiscal years 08 to 09.

- SC-2838 – In some circumstances, lowers the documentary service charge of motor vehicle dealers by specifying that the maximum charge is the lesser of the retail installment rate (at \$250 in current law) or 10% of the amount the buyer/lessee's contracted amount. In addition, the amendment recognizes that the law has permitted this type of charge regardless of the contract provisions since its inception.
- SC-2482 – Makes technical corrections at the request of the Department of Taxation to the business and personal property tax replacement payments to local taxing units.
- SC-2885 – Authorizes third party entities making capital investment project payments and leasing mixed-use project sites for a term of at least 20 years to claim the job retention tax credit. The site must include company headquarters and at least two of the following uses: office, hotel, research & development, or retail facilities. Additionally, the amendment removes the net operating loss study language.
- SC-2858 – Transfers funds (\$318,000) from the JFS computer services line item to the Civil Rights Commission in fiscal year 08 and requires the funds to be used for IT equipment.
- SC-2712 – Reduces the Commission on African American Males from 41 members to 23 members and moves the management to the Ohio State University African American and African Studies Community Extension Center.
- SC-2672 – Creates a Cancer Study Task Force to probe the cancer death rates among African Americans in Ohio.
- SC-2703-1 – Earmarks \$100,000 per fiscal year from the Healthy Ohio line item for the Center for Closing Health Gaps minority health programs.
- SC-2681 – Designates May as Nutrition and Physical Fitness Month.
- SC-2685 – Moves the capital appropriation from HB 699 of the 126th General Assembly for the Cleveland Playhouse from the Cultural Facilities Commission to Cleveland State University.
- SC-2614 – Makes clarifying changes to the Senate-added amendment regarding public nuisances in subsidized housing.
- SC-2494 – Corrects the earmarking totals for the AccelerateOhio line item in Board of Regents to reflect changes made in the Senate substitute version of the bill.
- SC-2698-1 – Earmarks funds from the TANF block grant for the Ohio Council of Urban Leagues for career development programs.
- SC-2480 – Corrects the line item name for the 235-521 line item to be "Ohio State University John Glenn School of Public Affairs."
- SC-2715-1 – Decreases the 600-523 line item of JFS and increases the 600-534 line item Adult Protective Services by the same amount (\$400,000 per fiscal year) and specifies how counties are to create maintenance of effort to receive funding from this program.
- SC-2738-1 – Increases the Correctional Institution Inspection Committee funding by \$45,000 per fiscal year by transferring funds from line item 504-321.
- SC-2732 – Transfers \$750,000 per fiscal year in non-GRF funds from Rehabilitation Services Commission line item 415-608 to 415-605 to ensure transparent tracking of community centers for the deaf funding.
- SC-2539 – Makes corrections to the Senate's substitute version of the bill by adding \$100,000 per fiscal year to the Ohio Historical Society's 360-502 line item and earmarks the funding added in that version of the bill (\$300,000 per fiscal year) for the state archives project.

- SC-2553 – Increases and earmarks the 235-583 line item by \$125,000 in each fiscal year for the Medina County University Center.
- SC-2578 – Makes additional corrective changes to the Senate substitute bill's language regarding residential rental property information filing requirements.
- SC-2754 – Clarifies that the Inspector General may employ and fix the compensation of deputy inspectors general and certain other employees.
- SC-2779 – Earmarks \$50,000 in each fiscal year for the Eastlake Senior Center from the 490-411 line item.
- SC-2891 – Increases the earmark for the Paul Laurence Dunbar Home by \$30,000 in fiscal year 08 from the 360-508 line item.
- SC-2471 – Adds an appropriation slated to go into the sub bill but left out due to a drafting error: 195-516 Shovel Ready Sites in Development. Also, makes LSC technical corrections to appropriation totals.
- SC-2658 – Increases the appropriation and earmark for the Wauseon project in the 195-520 Ohio Main Street Program to \$500,000 in fiscal year 08.
- SC-2495-1 – LSC technical.
