SCOPE OF WORK

Whirlpool Corporation City of Clyde/Marion, Sandusky/Marion Counties

On December 15, 2025, the Ohio Tax Credit Authority (“Authority”) approved a 1.453 percent, 9-year tax credit for Whirlpool Corporation (“Whirlpool”) for the creation of \$20,624,000 in new annual payroll as a result of the company’s project in the City of Clyde, Sandusky County and the City of Marion, Marion County. As part of the tax credit agreement, the Authority requires the company to maintain operations at the project location for at least twelve years.

Whirlpool is a leading home appliance company, in constant pursuit of improving life at home. The Clyde location is the world's largest clothes washer manufacturing facility, established in 1952. The Marion location is a clothes dryer manufacturing facility, operating since 1955.

Ohio is competing with Mexico and multiple countries in Asia for this proposed project. State support will help ensure the proposed project moves forward in Ohio.

The proposed project by Whirlpool in the City of Clyde/City of Marion, Sandusky/Marion County, involves investments in product improvements and enhancements to its washer and dryer lines. Whirlpool will invest \$300,000,000 in machinery and equipment costs for its proposed project.

Whirlpool expects to create 448 full-time equivalent employees, generating \$20,624,000 in new annual payroll and retain \$224,258,993 in existing payroll by 12/31/2029 at the project locations. In addition, the company will claim the tax credit on Ohio employee payroll generated at the project location in excess of the company’s baseline payroll at the project location.

By letters dated July 29, 2025, and November 11, 2025, Sandusky County and Marion County expressed support for the project.
